Walk from the Old Dungeon Ghyll

This walk can be done from the Old Dungeon Ghyll too – catch the 09.30 bus, arriving at Chapel Stile stores at 09.42. Join (and finish) the walk near Wainwrights.

Great Langdale ('long valley')

A glacial valley, surrounded by spectacular mountain scenery with rugged peaks, small tarns, ghylls and waterfalls. Its hard volcanic rock was used by Neolithic people to make stone axes. A popular destination for walkers and climbers. With limited parking space and narrow winding lanes – relax and take the bus!

Dungeon Ghyll Force

The impressive 60 foot waterfall is in a deep and shaded ravine and was a 'must see' on the itinerary of Victorian visitors. Close by is Stickle Ghyll, then up a steep path to Stickle Tarn. The Old Dungeon Ghyll Hotel is a favourite haunt for hikers with real ale and log fires – the end of the line for the bus

Chapel Stile

Another village which grew around the slate and gunpowder industries. Note the distinctive green slate of its nineteenth century houses and church. In the church-yard is buried Reverend Owen Lloyd - a friend of William Wordsworth who composed the grave's inscription. Refresh yourself at the local pub or café - then stock up with provisions at the village store.

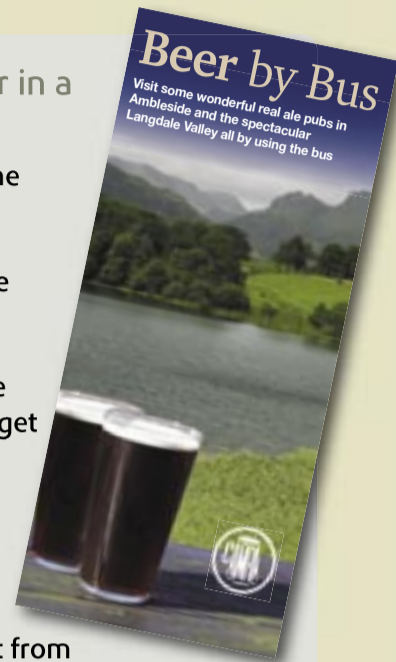

Beck, woodland and quarry walk

See map below

Catch the bus at 09.50 from the bus station in Ambleside, arriving at the Britannia Inn, Elterwater at 10.07. Cross over the stone bridge by the beck and turn right up the narrow road - you are now on the Cumbria Way. Follow this until the path branches down to the river and follow this until you reach a footbridge. This will take you to Wainwrights Inn. Just past there, take the footpath sign to the left for Baysbrown campsite. Keep following Great Langdale Beck, (with lovely views up the valley) until you see Oak Howe. Follow the track past here, taking the bridleway for Baysbrown Farm, which you will see in the distance. Then follow a quiet lane, passing Elterwater quarry to your left. At a house, turn left at the bridleway sign and follow the track through the quarry – take care here and follow signs. Stop and look at the information board to get a glimpse into the past and present of slate quarrying. Keep following the bridleway until you reach the beck again (claim your discount at Wainwrights by taking the footbridge) or keep the beck on your left, trace your footsteps back to the road and so return to Elterwater. You can catch the 14.37 bus back to Ambleside (14.44 at weekends and Public Holidays).

You could make this a later walk by catching the 11.50 bus from Ambleside and returning on the 16.29 from Elterwater (16.44 weekends and Public Holidays).

You could also walk right up Langdale (following the Cumbria Way) to the Old Dungeon Ghyll Hotel – a great walkers and climbers pub – catch the 16.15 back to Ambleside (16.30 at weekends and Public Holidays).

For a shorter walk from Elterwater follow the beck past Elter Water to Skelwith Force waterfall or take advantage of your discount at Langdale Hotel & Country Club.

Walking

If you are thinking of going walking, make sure that you are properly equipped, as the weather can change quickly. Check the weather before you go, get a mountain forecast from **0870 055 0575** or www.lake-district.go.uk/weatherline.

Ordnance Survey maps **OL 6 & OL 7** will be required for walks in this area.

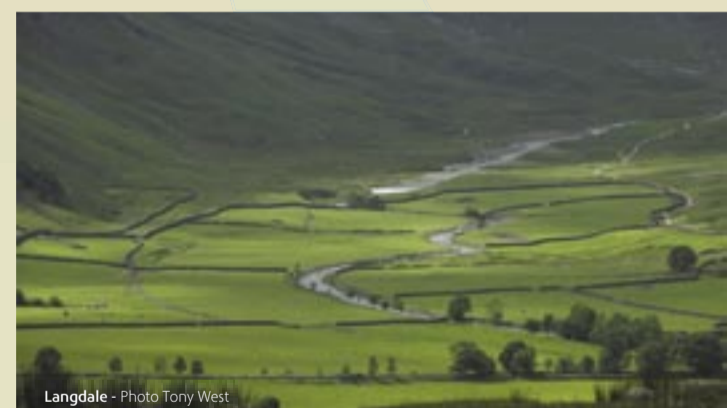
